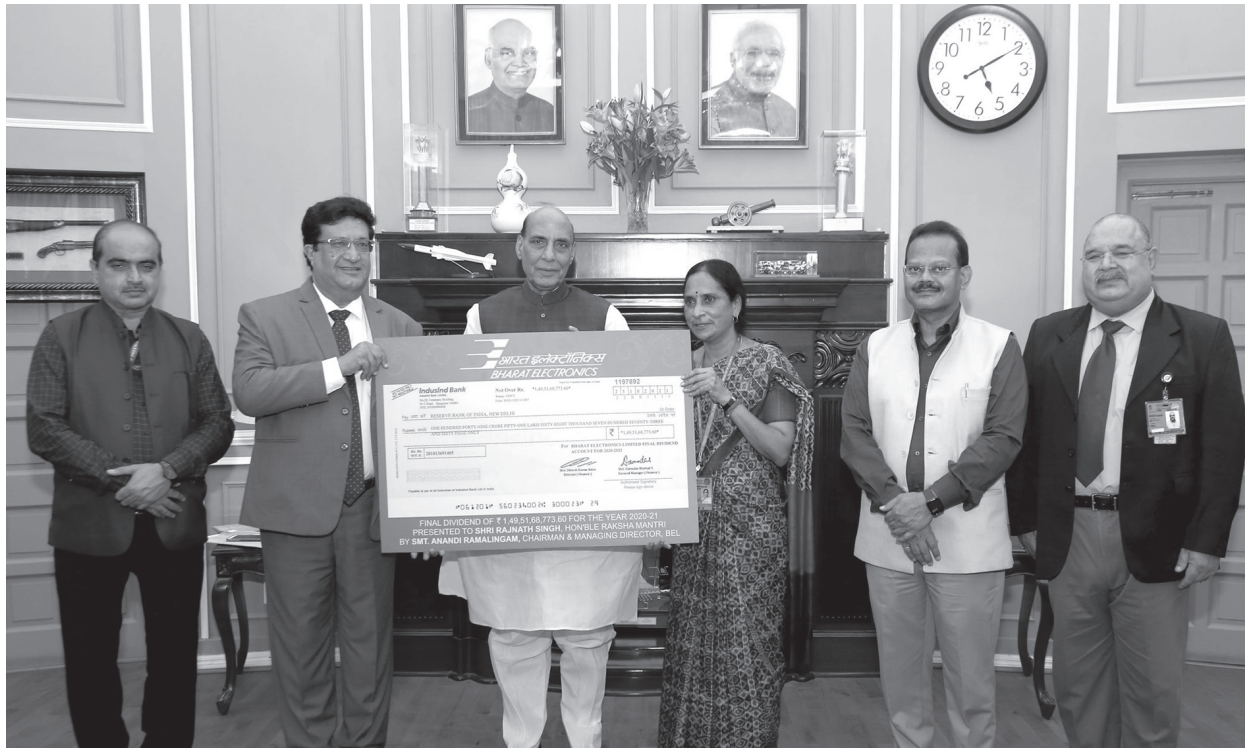

## India determined to protect legitimate rights in its territorial waters: Rajnath

**NEW DELHI, OCT 27 /--/** The rise of serious threats such as terrorism, drug trafficking, piracy and climate change have thrown new challenges for the Indo-Pacific at a time when the competition over its resources has intensified, defence minister Rajnath Singh said on Wednesday.

In an address at a conference on the Indo-Pacific, Singh said the nature of the challenges in the region has considerable trans-national implications that require a cooperative response. The defence minister also asserted that India is fully determined to protect its legitimate rights and interests in its territorial waters and exclusive economic zone while supporting the maintenance of rules-based maritime systems. "While competition over resources has intensified, the rise of serious threats such as terrorism, piracy, drug trafficking and climate change have thrown new challenges for the Indo-Pacific region," he said. "The nature of these challenges in the region has considerable trans-national implications that require a cooperative response. There is, therefore, a need to find convergence of interests and commonality of purpose on maritime issues," Singh said.

The defence minister said efficient, cooperative and collaborative harnessing of the region's maritime potential, remained essential for sustaining a steady path to prosperity. "India is committed to respecting the rights of all nations as laid down in the UN Convention on the Law of Seas (UNCLOS), 1982," he said. "We are fully determined to protect the legitimate rights and interests of our country

in relation to our territorial waters and Exclusive Economic Zone while supporting the maintenance of rules-based maritime systems as mandated under UNCLOS," he added.

Singh's comments came in the backdrop of growing global concern over China's increasing expansionist behaviour in the Indo-Pacific that has forced many countries to come out with strategies to deal with the challenge. In his remarks, Singh elaborated on how the oceans have shaped human history from time immemorial, influencing the evolution of life as well as culture.

"From an Indian perspective, looking West, archaeological explorations have revealed ancient maritime connections with other civilisations like Mesopotamia -- modern-day Iraq, Dilmun -- modern-day Bah-

rain, and Magan -- modern-day Oman," he said. The defence minister said that maritime linkages enabling the exchange of goods, culture and goodwill were foundational for mutual prosperity in the past, and continue to remain as such even today.

"Looking East, maritime linkages also played a vital role in taking Buddhism across the region, from Sri Lanka, South East Asian countries and all the way till Korea," he said. Singh noted that the amalgamation of ancient Indian folklore such as Ramayana and Mahabharata in South East Asian cultures is also a result of these maritime linkages. "In fact, the region was so inter-linked that according to a folklore, an Indian princess of Ayodhya married a Korean prince way back in the year 48 AD," he said. (PTI)

## SP, SBSP announce tie-up for 2022 UP polls, say people will drive out BJP from state

**MAU, OCT 27 /--/** The Samajwadi Party and the Suheldev Bhartiya Samaj Party on Wednesday announced their alliance for the 2022 Uttar Pradesh assembly polls and gave the slogan 'Khadeda Howe', a call to "drive out" the BJP from the state.

The slogan is on the lines of 'Khela Hobe' (game on), which was coined by the Mamata Banerjee-led Trinamool Congress for the West Bengal assembly polls that saw the party defeat the BJP and storm back to power for a third consecutive term. "Slogan 'Kheda Hobe' was given in West Bengal and 'didi' drove out the BJP from the state. Similarly, in Uttar Pradesh it will be 'Khadeda Howe' (drive out) and the BJP government will be removed by the people of the state," Suheldev Bhartiya Samaj Party (SBSP) president Om Prakash Rajbhar said here. Rajbhar was addressing a 'Vanchit, Pichhda, Dalit and Minoriti Bhagidari Mahapanchayat', during which Samajwadi Party (SP) chief Akhilesh Yadav announced the alliance between the two parties for the Assembly polls.

"When BJP leaders come to your village, you should ask them about price rise and then ask them to leave," Rajbhar said. Yadav said Rajbhar has rightly said that in Uttar Pradesh 'Khadeda Howe'. When red and yellow colours of the SP and the SBSP unite, everyone knows who is becoming 'laal-pila' (angry) in Delhi and Lucknow, the SP chief said in a reference to the BJP governments at the Centre and in the state. "Rajbhar will close the door through which the BJP came to power (in Uttar Pradesh) and SP workers will lock it," he said. "There was speculation before the alliance about which party will win how many seats. But after the alliance, even big agencies are saying no one can stop us," Yadav said. (PTI)

## Schools for all classes, colleges to reopen in Delhi from Nov 1 after 19 months

**NEW DELHI, OCT 27 /--/** After 19 months of closure due to the coronavirus pandemic, schools in the national capital will reopen from November 1 for all classes with 50 percent student strength, though classes will continue in the hybrid mode and no student will be forced to attend them offline.

All other educational institutions will also reopen from Monday, deputy chief minister Manish Sisodia said, announcing the decision taken at a meeting of the Delhi Disaster Management Authority (DDMA), and noted that the Covid-19 situation is under control in Delhi but "we cannot let our guard down". The Delhi government had earlier announced the reopening of schools for classes 9 to 12, colleges and coaching institutions from September 1 following a marked improvement in the Covid-19 situation in the national capital. However, this is the first time that schools will reopen for classes up to class 8 after the

outbreak of the epidemic. Sisodia said that due to school closure there has been an unprecedented loss of learning for the children. "This was also stated by experts in the DDMA meeting that making up for this loss will not be easy. Therefore, it has been decided that all schools should be reopened for all classes from November 1," the deputy chief minister said at a press conference. Sisodia also said that the Covid situation is under control but considering the situation in few countries at present and the upcoming festivals, there is need to be

cautious and not let our guard down." Sisodia, who is also Delhi's education minister, said as an expert committee had recommended, no parent will be forced to send their wards to school and education will continue in blended or hybrid mode (both online and offline classes). "Schools will have to ensure that not more than 50 percent of the students in a class should be called to schools and all the staff is required to be fully vaccinated as soon as possible. "Schools will also be required to make sure that their teaching and non-teaching staff is get vaccinated," he said. Quoting the figures shared in the DDMA meeting, Sisodia said around 98 percent of the teaching and non-teaching staff has received at least the first dose of Covid-19 vaccine. Asked about the concerns of a possible third wave, the education minister said: "If the situation turns bad, schools can always be asked to go back to online mode. It will depend on the situation." (PTI)

## Ayodhya included in Delhi govt free pilgrimage scheme: Kejriwal

**NEW DELHI, OCT 27 /--/** The Delhi Cabinet on Wednesday approved the inclusion of Ayodhya in its free pilgrimage scheme for the elderly, chief minister Arvind Kejriwal announced.

Kejriwal had on Tuesday offered prayers at the Ram Janambhoomi site in Ayodhya. "I had the privilege of visiting Shri Ram Lalla in Ayodhya yesterday. All I prayed for there was to channelise all my strength and resources in making it possible for as many people to visit Ram Lalla in Ayodhya as I can. I wish to be the Shrawan Kumar for the elderly and help them fulfil their ardent yearning to complete their Tirth Yatra, he said. "The Mukhya Mantri Teerath Yatra Yojna", the Delhi government bears

complete expenditure on free pilgrimage of senior citizens to places like Jagannath Puri, Rameshwaram, Shirdi, Mathura, Haridwar, Tirupati among others, he said.

Over 35,000 senior citizens have undertaken pilgrimage under the scheme. Due to Covid-19, the scheme was halted for the last one-and-a-half years, but now instructions have been issued to resume it and the trains for various destinations are expected to be started in the next one month, the chief minister said. The entire expense of leaving from home until returning which includes travelling by air conditioned trains, proper AC hotel stays, meals, local travel and more is borne by the Delhi government.

The elderly also have a

provision to take someone young as an attendant to help them along their journey, for whom the expenses are covered as well, he said. The Mukhyamantri Tirth Yatra Yojna was approved by the Delhi Cabinet on January 9, 2018. Any citizen from the national capital who is aged 60 years or more can avail the scheme after acquiring a certificate from their local MLA, stating that they live in the legislator's constituency. One attendant aged 21 years or more can accompany each traveller. Twelve Yatra routes are operative at present. Four-day long Delhi-Ayodhya-Delhi trip will be 13th in the list.

Eligible people have to apply online to benefit from this scheme. It can also be applied online by visiting the office of the divisional commissioner, the office of the MLA of the area, or the office of the Tirth Yatra Committee. Candidates are selected by a draw. (PTI)

## Pegasus: SC-appointed expert panel members have vast experience in cyber security, digital forensics

**NEW DELHI, OCT 27 /--/** Three experts on cyber security, digital forensics, networks and hardware were roped in by the Supreme Court on Wednesday to enquire, investigate and determine whether Pegasus spyware was used for snooping on citizens and their probe would be monitored by former apex court judge R V Raveendran.

The three-member technical panel, which has been given wide ranging powers, would comprise eminent experts, Naveen Kumar Chaudhary, Prabhakaran P and Ashwin Anil Gumaste and report to Justice Raveendran. Justice Raveendran would be assisted by former IPS officer Alok Joshi and Sundeep Oberoi -- Chairman, Sub Committee in International Organisation of Standardisation/ International Electro-Technical Commission/Joint Technical Committee) in monitoring the inquiry of the technical panel. A bench headed by Chief Justice N V Ramana said that the expert panel will have the power to en-

quire, investigate and determine whether the Pegasus spyware was used on phones or other devices of the citizens of India to access stored data, eavesdrop on conversations, intercept information and/or for any other purposes and the details of the victims and/or persons affected by such a spyware attack.

Chaudhary, the first member of the technical panel, is a Professor (Cyber Security and Digital Forensics) and Dean, National Forensic Sciences University, Gandhinagar, Gujarat. He has over two decades of experience as an academician, cyber security enabler and expert and specialises in cyber security policy, network vulnerability assessment and penetration testing, the apex court verdict said. The second member of the technical committee is Prabhakaran P, Professor (School of Engineering), Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham, Amritapuri, Kerala and has two decades of experience in computer science and security areas. His areas of interest are

malware detection, critical infrastructural security, complex binary analysis, Artificial intelligence and machine learning. He has many publications in reputed journals, the bench said. The third member of the technical committee, Gumaste is Institute Chair Associate Professor (Computer Science and Engineering), Indian Institute of Technology, Bombay, Maharashtra. "He has been granted 20 US patents and has published over 150 papers and authored 3 books in his field. He has received several National awards including the Vikram Sarabhai Research Award (2012) and Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar Prize for Science and Technology (2018). He has also held the position of Visiting Scientist at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, USA," the apex court said. Giving the details of the terms of reference, the verdict, penned by the CJI, said the panel would also enquire and investigate what steps/actions have been taken by the

Centre after reports were published in 2019 about hacking of WhatsApp accounts of Indian citizens, using the Pegasus suite of spyware, whether any Pegasus suite was acquired by the Union of India, or any state government, or any central or state agency for use against the citizens of India. (PTI)
